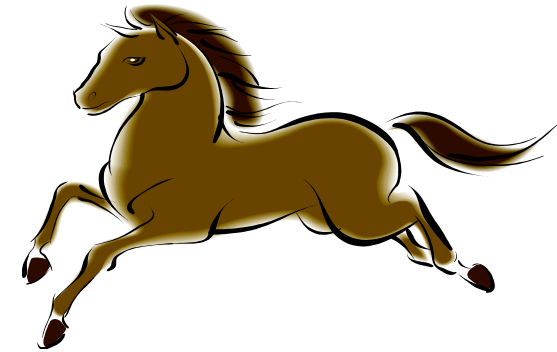

More Prizes awarded throughout each day of competition*

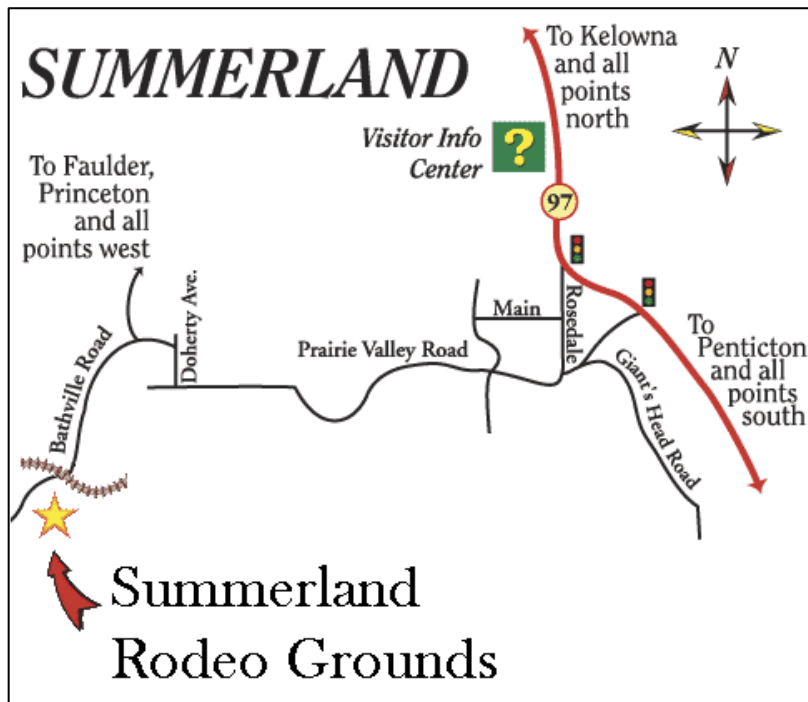

Rules

1. Current HCBC Rule Book for General Performance shall be in effect. A copy will be available in the Show Office, or download your own from <http://www.hcbc.ca/Competition.html>. Any discrepancy or vagueness in the HCBC rulebook, the judge will then defer to Equine Canada rules.
2. The show committee reserve the right to divide, combine, change or cancel classes.
3. Inappropriate or unsafe attire or tack may be penalized at the discretion of the judge.
4. Riders using abusive language or mistreating horses in any way may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be disqualified from the show and asked to leave the show grounds immediately. The committee may also disqualify any horses which appear ill or lame.
5. Approved Helmets are mandatory for all Juniors & Intermediates (English and Western) and all age divisions in English.
6. Stallions MUST be ridden/handled by Senior competitors, and CANNOT be stabled overnight on the Grounds.
7. **AGE DIVISIONS:** Senior: 19 years and older as of January 1, 2011. Intermediate: 14 years to 18 years old as of January 1, 2011. Junior: 13 years and under as of January 1, 2011. Walk/Trot or Walk/Jog entries can only enter classes designated as such for that show day. EXCEPTIONS: Walk/Trot or Walk/Jog entries may also enter Showmanship, Halter and Hunter x-poles classes. Walk/Jog classes may be ridden two-handed if using a snaffle bit (or one-handed in a shanked bit).
8. The Judge's decision will be final. Protests or appeals must be made in writing, within 12 hours of the time of the cause of the protest, and submitted with a deposit of \$50 cash to the Show Secretary.
9. No refunds without a Veterinarian's or Doctor's Certificate.
10. **All dogs on leash and to be cleaned up after!** If you can't keep them leashed and clean up after them, leave them at home!
11. **BC Heritage Log Books** can be purchased at the show office or purchased prior to the show from HCBC. Logbooks **MUST** be dropped off in the show office **PRIOR** to the start of the show, or your points will not count.

Class Descriptions *(more detailed descriptions available in the Rule Books)*

- Barrel Racing:** Barrel racing is a timed event using three barrels raced in a clover-leaf pattern.
- Command Class:** Commands are announced, and entries are eliminated one at a time as commands are not executed correctly, until only the winner remains.
- Halter:** Horses to be shown in hand and to be judged on their conformation and movement.
- Hunter:** To be judged on the horse's movement, manners, and way of going over fences.
- Hunter Hack:** Entries judged on rail work and to jump two fences not exceeding 2'3".
- Hunter Under Saddle:** This class will be judged on performance, condition and conformation.
- Little Britches:** For riders 12 & under, no cross entries. To walk and trot/jog only. Leadlines allowed.
- Pole Bending:** Pole Bending is a timed event weaving a pattern through 6 poles.
- Reining:** The best reined horse should be wilfully guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance. Pattern to be posted.
- Road Hack:** To be shown at a walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Horse to have smooth, ground-covering gaits.
- Show Hack:** Show hacks must have vitality, animation, presence, balance and clean fine limbs showing supreme quality.
- Showmanship:** Judged on performance and turnout of self and horse. Pattern to be posted.
- Trail/Handy Horse:** Judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response of rider and quality of movement. Pattern to be posted.
- Western and English Pleasure:** Judged on the horse that is a pleasure to ride. May be asked to extend at any gait. Western riders to sit the extended jog. English to be judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation.
- Western and English Pleasure STAKE:** To be ridden as a pleasure class (described above), but horse/rider combination must have ridden the equivalent pleasure class (of their appropriate division) to be eligible to enter the Stake class. Prize money will be awarded 50% for 1st, 40% for 2nd, 30% for 3rd, 20% for 4th.
- Western and Hunt Seat Equitation:** Riders will be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, appointments and suitability of horse to rider. Pattern may be required.
- Western Horsemanship:** Judged on the rider's ability to execute both a pattern and rail work, with precision and smoothness while maintaining a correct body position.
- Western Riding:** A pattern class where the horse is judged on quality of gaits, lead changes at the lope, response to rider, manners and disposition. Pattern to be posted.
